this collection of ten critical essays is the first scholarly criticism of haiku by sonia sanchez who has exemplified herself for six decades as a major figure in the black arts movement a central activist in civil rights and women s movements and an internationally known writer in american literature sanchez s haiku as an integral and prominent part of contemporary african american poetry have expressed not only her ideas of nature beauty and harmony but also her aesthetic experience of music culture and love aesthetically this experience reflects a poetic mind which has helped the poet to shape or reimage her poetic spirit

williams xavier u presents 367 three to four page essays 101 commissioned new for this edition on significant african american works of literature from afrocentricity the theory of social change a work of cultural criticism by molefi k asante to zami a new spelling of my name the biomythography of audre lorde the works covered range from early colonial era writings through works of the beginning of the 21st century most of the essays address a single long work while others review an author s work in a certain genre such as short fiction poetry essays or speeches each entry begins with information on title subtitle author s name and birth death dates type of work date of first publication and production for fiction information is also presented on type of plot setting and principal characters the essays then describe events or contents of the work and address broad themes and meanings connected to the work essays on fiction works include discussion of main character or characters while nonfiction work includes sections on form and content and analysis all essays end with discussion of critical context also included with the essays are annotated bibliographies on secondary sources the final volume includes indexes organized by type of work title and authors examples of works covered in addition to the two already mentioned include ain t i a woman by bell hooks the autobiography of malcolm x babel 17 by samuel r delany the black muslims in america by c eric lincoln the content of our character by shelby steele kindred by octavia e butler roots by alex haley

the first thematic series published for american literature the wadsworth themes in american literature series is currently comprised of 21 themes spanning the time period normally covered in the two semester american literature survey course 1492 to the present each carefully edited booklet centers on a core issue of the period with attention given to the development of key themes each thematic booklet offers an introductory contextual essay a variety of literary perspectives headnotes and footnotes along with a variety of visual elements henry hart is a contemporary poet biographer and critic with a broad range of work to his credit he currently holds a chair in literature at the college of william and mary his themes are drawn from the postwar era and he puts before readers a seductive range of work by poets fiction writers and essayists many of the themes from earlier volumes find their culmination here hart offers students a chance to think hard about the matter of ethnicity and race in contemporary america he explores the role of class gender and sexuality in american society in all these thematic booklets by hart are certain to challenge entertain and instruct

in 1965 dudley f randall founded the broadside press a company devoted to publishing distributing and promoting the works of black poets and writers in so doing he became a major player in the civil rights movement hundreds of black writers were given an outlet for their work and for their calls for equality and black identity though broadside was established on a minimal budget randalls unique skills made the press successful he was trained as a librarian and had spent decades studying and writing poetry most importantly randall was totally committed to the advancement of black literature the famous and relatively unknown sought out broadside including such writers as gwendolyn brooks margaret walker mae jackson lance jeffers etheridge knight sonia sanchez nikki giovanni audre lorde and sterling d plumpp his story is one of battling to promote black identity and equality through literature and thus lifting the cultural lives of all americans

stephen henderson has edited an anthology of the best of black poetry with an emphasis on the poetry of the 60 s but this anthology differs from others in significant ways first the introduction is extensive giving tentative answers to such questions as what makes a poem black who decides what criteria does one use the author s thesis is that the new black poetry s main referents are black speech and black music second the author explores the many forms that black poets use commenting on what is black technically in the poetry third the poems anthologized include examples from the oral folk sermon spirituals blues ballad rap as well as the literary tradition from publisher s description

for courses focusing on african american writers these courses are offered in english departments ethnic studies departments and african american studies departments this comprehensive collection of afro american literature from its beginnings to the 1970s provides a generous selection of autobiographies essays speeches letters political pamphlets histories journals and folk literature as well as poems plays and stories all chosen for their artistic and social significance a carefully structured organization and the
